Ways to help me say... 'ch'



1. Show me (visual cues)

- Help me look in a mirror so I can see my round lips
- You model the sound by repeating lots of words that contain the 'ch' sound

2. Tell me these tips (verbal cues)

- "Push your lips forward."
- "Make it sound quick."

3. Help me say my sound in:

- Isolation
- Syllables (e.g. chee, char, orch, ooch)
- Beginning of words (e.g. cheese, chair)
- End of words (e.g. beach, watch)
- Phrases (e.g. sit on a chair)

4. Other tips which might help me:

- Aspiration Trick to help blend (e.g. chair = ch-hair / ch-hip)
- You may like to practice by pretending to sneeze ("ahhh-choo") or a train ("choo-choo")
