Dr Anne Sved-Williams, AM, worked as a general practitioner for 10 years and part-time in child psychiatry. She trained in family therapy at the Ackerman Family Institute in New York before completing formal psychiatric training. Dr Sved-Williams has since been Medical Director of South Australia's, Helen Mayo House Mother-Baby psychiatric inpatient unit for 31 years. Her teaching interests have included primary care psychiatry, in addition to developing certificates of perinatal and infant mental health training, and the annual Helen Mayo House conferences for the last 25 years. Her research interests over the past 10 years have been in mothers with borderline personality disorders in the perinatal period. She has produced 30 publications, edited a book on Infants of Parents with Mental Illness, and has written 3 book chapters and 2 children's picture-story books (e.g., Meltdown Moments) for families with mentally ill mothers.
