
Ways to help me say... 'f'



1. Show me (visual cues)

- Help me look in a mirror so I can see my top teeth touch my bottom lip
- You model the sound by repeating lots of words that contain the 'f' sound

2. Tell me these tips (verbal cues)

- "Show me your bunny teeth."
- "Keep your teeth touching your bottom lip."
- "Gently blow the air out."

3. Help me say my sound in:

- Isolation
- Syllables (e.g. far, fow, foo, fay, eef, arf)
- Beginning of words (e.g. four, feet)
- End of words (e.g. off, leaf)
- Phrases (e.g. I rolled a four)

Please give me lots of **praise**.

e.g. "That was a nice 'f' sound! I can see your bunny teeth"

You can also praise me for good sitting/listening/looking/trying e.g. "Good trying"

"I'm getting better at saying my 'f' sound each time we practice

4. Other tips which might help me:

- Aspiration Trick to help blend
 (e.g. four = f-hour, feet = f-heet)
- You may need to touch my bottom lip to show me where to put my teeth
