

Ways to help me say... 'v'



1. Show me (visual cues)

- Help me look in a mirror so I can see my top teeth touch my bottom lip
- You model the sound by repeating lots of words that contain the 'v' sound

2. Tell me these tips (verbal cues)

- "Show me your vampire teeth."
- "Keep your teeth touching your bottom lip."
- "Make it buzzy and gently blow the air out."

3. Help me say my sound in:

- Isolation
- Syllables (e.g. var, vow, voo, vay, eev, arv)
- Beginning of words (e.g. vine, vase)
- End of words (e.g. leave)
- Phrases (e.g. I saw a van)

4. Other tips which might help me:

- You may need to touch my bottom lip to show me where to put my teeth

Please give me lots of **praise**.
e.g. "That was a nice 'v' sound! I saw
your teeth bite your lip"
You can also praise me for good
sitting/listening/looking/trying e.g.
"Good trying"
**"I'm getting better at saying my 'v'
sound each time we practice
together!"**
